This year has been like a football match, a tale of two halves! The first had our small maintenance team of Brendan, Colin and Geoff undertaking (Covid essential) maintenance, and some limited projects. Then the second half saw the return of our Volunteer Team, including a group of younger volunteers from the White and Red Eagle Association, part of the Polish community in Yorkshire. Work has increased at a phenomenal rate since the summer, with some of the projects highlighted below, showcasing our ability to not only survive, but thrive and evolve:

Front Entrance

Keeping the Main Entrance clean, is like painting the Forth Road Bridge!







Café Interior

Good News story from Covid. B&Q closed their Café, so we bought all their tables & chairs for our Café, at a snip. Tony, one of our resident chippy's, has built the new main Café counter.



Café Exterior

The external walls have been undergoing some renovation and rendering.



Garden Wall & Fencing

The Garden Wall was in a poor state, and has now been rendered; and the Garden Fence has been re-creosoted.









Inner Court Yard

Before building work and rendering could begin, cleaning the walls of 70 years of moss, algae and loose masonry was made so much easier by using a Karcher.





Families Nissen Hut

Work continues inside and out, with the hanging of the original doors, and re-painting of the wooden window frame.







New Gates

A new set of side gates were installed, to allow for additional access.



New Reception & Shop

Our other chippy Graham, has built our new Reception Counter, and the Reception & Shop will hopefully open in the spring; and Carol and her team, levelled ground and laid a grass verge outside the Reception.







Utilities

Basic utilities were finally installed on-Site, with mains water supplied to Toilet Block and Treatment plant, and mains electricity installed across the entire Site, including the portacabins.

Workshop ceiling

Condensation is never a great thing to have in a Workshop, so we've had foam insulation sprayed on the ceiling.





Workshop concreting

You may recall that in Sep 20 our volunteers laid a concrete apron along the north side of the Workshop, which subsequently had racking installed on it, thanks to the generosity of Mike Erentraut, of Erentek Ltd. In this last week before Christmas, we've also managed to lay the south side apron; meaning the Workshop will be operational early in the New Year.









Main Exhibition Centre (MEC) Main Entrance

Preparation works for the new Main Exhibition Centre are underway, with the stabilising the new Main Entrance, which despite its aperture, had never had a RSJ/Lintel installed above the door during its time as an agricultural store. Two new columns were also built.



MEC Roof Removal

Removing the old WW2 roof of the North Wing, proved to be both challenging and exhausting work for our volunteers. The steel roof trusses will now be shot-blasted and powder coated, prior to the new roof being installed.



Memorandum of Understanding

On 11 December, Richard Kornicki, Chairman of Polish Air Force Memorial Committee (PAFMC) and Geoff Burton, Chairman of RAF Ingham, met at the iconic Dambusters Pub in Scampton village, to sign the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) document, which formally completed the agreement between both organisations.

The agreement is designed to support both organisations in:

- Promoting the history and heritage of the Polish Air Force in Britain during the Second World War.
- Publicising the huge contribution made by Polish airmen and women, to the Allied war effort.
- Acting as focal points, for enquiries involving the Polish Air Force in Britain during the Second World War.
- Promoting Polish/British friendship and continued integration.





Fundraising Achievements



Business Resilience Grant

Through summer, we were able to claim Business Resilience Grant, which allowed us to purchase Covid prevention equipment, including hand sanitizer dispensers, counter screens and contactless payment machines. We are also bringing internet services to the Site, with a new dedicated phone line. And finally, we've purchased Picnic Tables and Benches made from recycled plastic; these will provide a welcoming rest and relaxation facility for both visitors and volunteers alike.


Main Exhibition Centre Appeal



MAIN EXHIBITION CENTRE - Appeal

Our aim is to create a globally unique Heritage Centre in the heart of Lincolnshire. Dedicated to remembering and celebrating the remarkable lives and stories of the men and women of the Polish Air Force Bomber Squadrons, who worked and flew alongside the RAF during WW2.

The project involves the complete renovation of the old 'Airmen's Mess', to create a new **Main Exhibition Centre** building, with a combined exhibition space of 290.95m²; featuring two Exhibition Halls, a Cinema/Media Suite, a Polish Families Resettlement Hut, Research Facility, Meeting Room, Cafe and Toilets.
