'Airmen's Rest' - Cafe



Another of our planned projects, is to create and open our own Cafe, in the former aptly named 'Food Preparation Building'. The Cafe, once completed, will be able to serve hot and



cold snacks, teas & coffees, cakes and ice creams. Much of the catering tables and work surfaces have been recycled from a previous life, and are being cleaned and sterilised prior to being fitted in the new Cafe.

Polish Resettlement - Nissen Hut

As you will no doubt be aware, if you've been able to visit our Heritage Centre over the last few years, we managed to rescue enough parts from the old Nissen Huts, on the old Polish Families Resettlement Unit site in Ingham village (before it was completely flattened a few years ago). This has allowed us to recreate and exact replica of the Nissen Huts occupied by Polish Air Force families, after they'd been de-mobbed, after the war. The Nissen Huts were originally Barrack Blocks, consisting of a metal tube with a brick wall at either end. Due to an acute housing shortage immediately post war, the War Dept created a design to convert these former barracks, into temporary family homes, by building internal walls, to create two bedrooms, a bathroom, and main family living room, and a pantry.

The latest part of this Project has involved the reclamation of a front door and four internal panelled doors. Tony Jablonski, (cabinet maker), and whose father was on 300 Sqn, helped to restore the Doors ravaged by woodworm; the Team then primered the doors; and Tony Gordon, made the door frame and hung all five doors. All that's now needed is some door furniture and a coat of top paint. Thanks for a great team effort.

Although 199 Squadron were only based at RAF Ingham between Feb to Jun 1943, fifty-seven names of squadron

Over the past few weeks, my husband Tony and I have been on holiday in the County, from our home in the north west. This has allowed us to come along on Sundays, as volunteers, and help in the ongoing work at Ingham.
